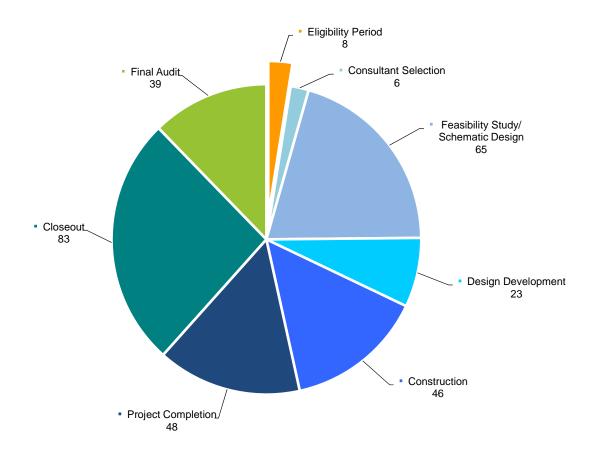
Project Overview Report January 8, 2014

A total of 318 projects that have received invitations from the Board of Directors ("Board") to collaborate with the MSBA are currently in the MSBA's Eligibility Period and Capital Pipeline. The following summary chart provides the number of projects in the Eligibility Period and each phase of the Capital Pipeline:



Statement of Interest ("SOI")

2013 SOI Process

The Fiscal Year 2013 SOI Process opened on January 9, 2013 and closed on April 10, 2013; 117 Districts submitted 201 Statements of Interest. MSBA review of the 2013 SOIs is complete.

50 of the of the 201 SOIs have been invited into the Accelerated Repair Program at the June, July, and October Board meetings, closing invites into the Accelerated Repair Program for 2013.

To date, seven SOIs have been invited into the Eligibility Period at the October and November Board meetings. An additional seven invites are anticipated for the January 2014 meeting, and three invites at the March 2014 meeting.

2014 SOI Process

The Fiscal Year 2014 SOI filing period opened on **January 10, 2014.** SOI submission deadlines are as follows:

- The SOI closing date for districts submitting for consideration in the Accelerated Repair Program, which is primarily for the repair and/or replacement of windows, roofs, and/or boilers in an otherwise structurally sound facility, is **February 14, 2014**.
- The SOI closing date for districts submitting for consideration in the Core Program, which is primarily for projects beyond the scope of Accelerated Repair, including extensive repairs, renovations, addition/renovations, and new school construction, is **April 11, 2014**.

Eligibility Period

There are eight districts in the Eligibility Period. Five of the eight districts have already secured funding. The remaining three districts have yet to confirm their date for action.

An agreed-upon enrollment is a key prerequisite for the MSBA to commence a Feasibility Study with a district. To begin the enrollment projection process, a district must file enrollment information utilizing the MSBA's online enrollment projection tool. Since the last report, one district has completed the enrollment process.

Based upon the schedules anticipated by the districts for completion of the Eligibility Period requirements, staff anticipates recommending the eight districts in Eligibility Period for an Invitation to Feasibility Study at upcoming Board meetings.

Capital Pipeline

Consultant Selection

After the district has completed all Eligibility Period requirements and has received a Board Invitation to Feasibility Study, the district procures an Owner's Project Manager ("OPM"). There are three districts in the Capital Pipeline that need to procure an OPM.

After a district has selected and executed a contract with an OPM, it selects a Designer utilizing either a local designer selection process for projects under \$5 million or the MSBA's Designer Selection Panel ("DSP") for projects over \$5 million. There are two districts in the Capital Pipeline that are in the process of procuring a Designer.

Feasibility Study

Once a district has procured an OPM and Designer and a Feasibility Study Agreement has been executed, the district and its consultants must complete two Feasibility Study submittals, the Preliminary Design Program and the Preferred Schematic Report, prior to Board consideration to proceed into Schematic Design. Based on the

most recent data and schedules provided to the MSBA by districts, the MSBA anticipates that six districts will present their preferred schematic designs to the Board at the upcoming March and June Board meetings.

Prior to consideration by the Board for Project Scope and Budget authorization, a district must submit a schematic design to the MSBA for review. Based on the most recent data and schedules provided to the MSBA by districts, the MSBA anticipates that seven districts will appear before the Board for Project Scope and Budget Agreement authorization at the upcoming March and June Board meetings.

Commissioning

Since the last report, the MSBA has assigned Commissioning Consultants to an additional nine projects presented in the table below. To date, the MSBA has executed 244 Commissioning Consultant contracts, totaling \$19.2 million; 91 contracts have been completed.

Design Development

Once a district has secured local funding and has entered into a Project Funding Agreement with the MSBA, it enters the Design Development phase. Currently, there are 23 projects in the Design Development phase with a total estimated construction cost of approximately \$539.7 million: 11 Accelerated Repair projects and 12 Core Program projects. The 12 Core Program projects in Design Development have a total estimated construction cost of approximately \$523 million:

Construction

When a district issues a Notice to Proceed, the project is advanced to the Construction phase. Currently, there are 46 projects in the Construction phase with a total estimated construction cost of \$1.863 billion: one Green Repair project, five Accelerated Repair projects, two Science Lab Initiative projects, and 38 Core Program projects. The 38 Core Program projects have a total estimated construction cost of \$1.795 billion and are listed below. This does not include the 48 projects that have reached substantial completion and are currently in the Project Completion phase.

Core Program – Total Project Budget Update

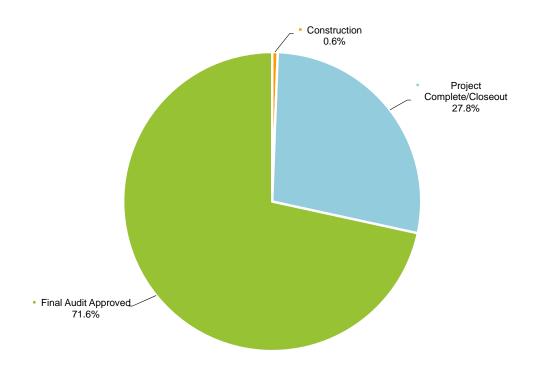
Upon receiving the Board's approval of the Project Scope and Budget, the MSBA and participating districts enter into a Project Funding Agreement that establishes the Total Project Budget and the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant for an approved project. Of the grants authorized by the Board, nine projects have increased their Total Project Budgets due to acceptance of construction bids higher than the project estimates, and one project has increased its Total Project Budget due to an increase in its site acquisition cost budget. In no event has the increase in budget resulted in an increase to the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant as authorized by the Board. Please note that staff reported on the budget increases for the eight projects shaded below at previous Board meetings.

Status of Green Repair Program

169 projects participating in the Green Repair Program have received authorization to enter into a PFA, totaling \$366,647,226 in Total Project Costs and \$222,885,258 in MSBA grants.



Since the November report, 14 additional projects have had a Final Audit Approved, one project remains in construction with an anticipated completion in January 2014.

Green Repair - Schedule Extension Update

Eight of the 169 Green Repair Projects did not meet their anticipated construction completion deadline in 2012. Schedule delays can be attributed to bid protests, lead time for windows, and construction delays on site.

The MSBA granted each district a conditional extension to its Project Funding Agreement pending compliance with the following stipulations:

- The district needed to submit a detailed, revised construction timeline showing how the work will be completed at each school by August 30, 2013;
- An Amendment to the Project Funding Agreement between the MSBA and the district needed to be executed to include the updated project schedule; and
- Any costs that may result from the district's requested extension of the construction schedule will be the sole responsibility of the district and are categorically ineligible for reimbursement by the MSBA.

Each of these projects has a revised construction schedule and will be complete by the beginning of the 2013-2014 school year. In no event has the extended schedule resulted in an increase to the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant as authorized by the Board. Please note that staff reported on the schedule extensions for the eight projects shaded below at previous Board meetings: Since last report, the remaining projects have achieved substantial completion. *No changes to this report.*

Green Repair - Total Project Budget Update

Upon receiving the Board's approval of the Project Scope and Budget, the MSBA and participating districts enter into a Project Funding Agreement that establishes the Total Project Budget and the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant for an approved project. Of the 169 grants authorized by the Board for the Green Repair Program, 17 projects have increased their Total Project Budgets due to acceptance of construction bids higher than the project estimates, or as a result of change orders issued on the project. In no event has the increase in budget resulted in an increase to the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant as authorized by the Board. Please also note that staff reported on the budget increases for all 17 of the projects shaded and shown below at previous Board meetings. *No changes to this report.*

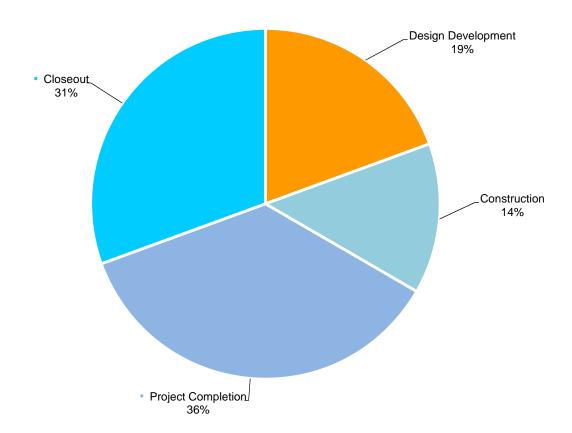

Status of Accelerated Repair Program

Currently there are a total of 50 districts, representing 83 projects, in the Accelerated Repair Program.

2012 Accelerated Repair Program

All 24 districts, representing 36 projects, approved in 2012 are under contract with consultants and have been authorized to enter into a PFA, totaling \$63,009,653 in Total Project Costs and a maximum of \$38,267,952 in MSBA Total Facilities Grant funding. Of the 36 projects, 28 are scheduled to complete construction in 2013, and eight are scheduled to complete construction in 2014. The chart below represents the progress of the 36 projects approved in 2012.



2013 Accelerated Repair Program

At the November Board Meeting, one district, representing one project, was removed from the Program. Following the Board's vote, the Accelerated Repair Program has 26 districts, representing 47 projects. Of the 26 districts, 21 districts, representing 32 projects, are seeking approval for Project Funding Agreements at the January Board Meeting.
