Construction Estimate vs. Bid Amount

- Out of 36 projects, 32 bids were received in 2013. The remaining four projects are scheduled to be bid in 2014.
- Of the 32, 30 bids have been reported.
- Of the 30 projects, 25 bids came within the estimated budget.

Whitman-Hanson RSD: Maquan Elementary School

Update on Project Scope and Budget Authorization

- MSBA Board approval on July 31, 2013.
- Local Authorization Vote was on October 7, 2013.
- Project advancement was contingent upon votes by the Town of Hanson at Town Meeting. The District reported a procedural error in the Town Meeting vote, and as a result they have concluded that the vote passed.
- The School District seeks additional time for the Town of Hanson to now proceed with a ballot vote.

Staff supports an additional extension beyond the 120-day deadline to June 4, 2014 in furtherance of the School District's efforts to secure funding for the proposed project.



MSBA Sustainable Design Policy Update

Why is MSBA updating its guidelines?

- Revisions to MA State Building Code / International Energy Conservation Code
 - Requires the use of 2012 IECC as of July 2014
 - Future of the current Stretch Energy Code is uncertain
- Revisions to US Green Building Council's LEED-S
 - "Version 4" opened for registration November 2013
 - Includes 2010 ASHRAE 90.1 Energy Standard for Buildings
- Revisions to CHPS National Core Criteria
 - Version 2.0 was completed February 2014
 - Includes 2012 IECC & 2010 ASHRAE 90.1 Energy Standard for Buildings
 - Current MA-CHPS requires compliance with Stretch Energy Code
 - Some state updates are in process, based on the CHPS Core Criteria
 - Revisions still underway



Recommended Policy for MSBA Sustainable Schools

Minimum Requirements

Current Policy

Using 2009 MA-CHPS, for no additional reimbursement, achieve a level of Verified / 40 points for new construction, 35 points for renovation,

OR;

Using 2009 LEED-S, for no additional reimbursement, achieve a level of Certified / 40 points, including a minimum of 5 points in EA Credit #1.

Proposed Policy

No MA-CHPS registration currently available.

OR;

Using LEED-S V4, for no additional reimbursement, achieve a minimum of Certified / 40 points.

Additional Requirements

Current Policy

Using 2009 MA-CHPS, for 2% additional reimbursement, achieve a level of Leader / 50 points for new construction, 45 points for renovation,

OR;

Using 2009 LEED-S, for 2% additional reimbursement, achieve a level of Silver / 50 points, including a minimum of 5 points in EA Credit #1.

Proposed Policy

No MA-CHPS registration currently available.

OR;

Using LEED-S V4, for 2% additional reimbursement, achieve a minimum of Silver / 50 points, including a minimum of 6 points in EA Credit #2.

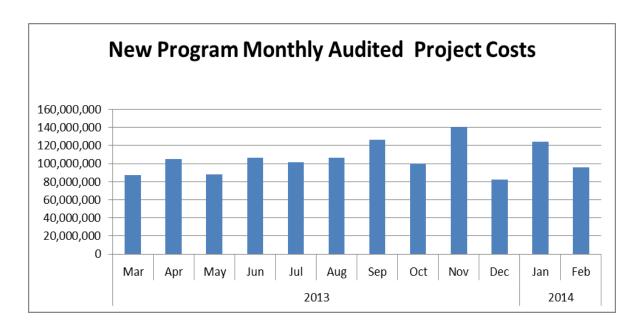

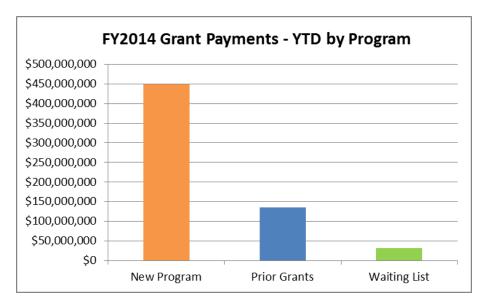

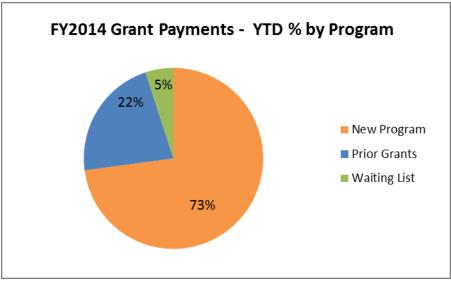
