Discussion

MSBA staff reviewed the documents provided by the District and met with the District and its consultants to discuss scope and budget. The District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$7,805,726, which includes an estimated construction cost of \$5,861,090 (\$46/sf). The basis of the estimated maximum Total Facilities Grant would be \$7,070,860, which excludes legal fees, costs associated with abatement of asbestos-containing floor materials, costs associated with fixtures, furnishings and equipment, costs associated with mailing and moving, and owner's and construction contingency costs.
