## **Discussion**

MSBA staff reviewed the documents provided by the District and met with the District and its consultants to discuss the project's scope and budget. The District has provided a Total Project Budget of \$151,661,968, which includes an estimated construction cost of \$119,178,907 (\$624/sq. ft.). The Estimated Basis of Total Facilities Grant would be \$81,719,383, which excludes the following items: legal fees; OPM and Designer fees associated with scope excluded building costs; costs associated with abatement of asbestos-containing floor materials; site costs in excess of 8% of total building cost; construction costs in excess of \$333/sq. ft. plus eligible demolition and abatement; costs associated with mailing and moving; costs in excess of the \$1,200 per student allowance for fixtures, furniture, and equipment; costs in excess of the \$1,200 per student allowance for technology; and owner's and construction contingency costs.

Additionally, costs associated with the commissioning of ineligible square footage will result in the recovery of a portion of the overall commissioning cost. The MSBA has calculated this recovery of commissioning-related funds to be \$10,568, which has been deducted from the Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant and the Maximum Total Facilities Grant.

MSBA staff recommends an Estimated Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$37,457,769; however, the District may be eligible for up to an additional \$985,051 in grant funds, subject to the MSBA's review and audit of the District's owner's and construction contingency expenditures. Accordingly, staff recommends a Maximum Total Facilities Grant of \$38,442,820 for the Project Scope and Budget Agreement and Project Funding Agreement to replace the existing West Elementary School with a new facility serving grades PK-5 on the site of the existing West Elementary School.
